VISITING PRACTITIONER: DR G. G. JENNER

Dr G. G. Jenner has commenced duty as Visiting Practitioner. He will be visiting doctors throughout the South Island.

For the past 28 years Dr Jenner has been in general practice in Dunedin. Apart from his active interest in the Royal College of General Practitioners, and the newly formed New Zealand College of General Practitioners, he has served for many years as a member of both the Pharmacology and Therapeutics Advisory Committee, and the Committee on Adverse Drug Reactions.
